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PACANZ Annual General Meeting 2017 - Summary

The 2017 AGM was held on May 6th in Christchurch. The meeting was attended by 34 delegates and Life members.

The following items were voted on:

- Subs for 2018 will increase to \$130
- Entry Fees and Apra Levies for 2018 will remain at \$1.00 & .95c
- Auditor for 2017/2018 is Mead Stark
- Honorary Solicitor is Rachel Adams of Adams Law
- Patron is Bronwyn Bennett
- <u>Bronwyn Chalmers</u> was re-elected as Northern North Island Delegate
- <u>Joanne La Grouw</u> was elected as the Cent North Island delegate as Tracey Andrew did not seek re-election
- <u>Cat Densham</u> was re-elected as the Southern South Island delegate.
- <u>Bronwyn Chalmers</u> was re-elected as Vice President
- The <u>Venue</u> for the <u>2018 Annual</u> <u>General Meeting</u> was confirmed as Auckland.

The 2017 Conference was held in the afternoon with and NYPA Forum –

facilitated by **Irene Mosley** of **Results** Consulting.

Irene guided the membership in lively and robust discussion on the following NYPA topics.

- Adjudicator appointment processes and expectations.
- Separation of males and females in competition.
- Master classes versus Technical classes.
- Competitors in full time training and the definition of professional.
- NZ Citizenship ruling or lack thereof.
- Structure of the PACANZ Board and the ability to co-opt.
- Competition & Theatre etiquette and the guidance from teachers
- Cross genre appreciation at the NYPA
- Changing methods of communication, social media, keyboard warriors, trolling, texting and Instagram.
- Open invitation for all Societies to submit NYPA Adjudicator suggestions. Full detail from the AGM is included in this Newsletter.

Annual General Meeting 2017

The AGM in Christchurch carried on the tradition of high calibre Conference discussions which created an atmosphere of positivity and excitement for the future. The attendees participated fully in the lively NYPA Forum and facilitator Irene Mosley did an excellent job of keeping the meeting on track and on time. The cross genre and geographically diverse points of view ensured that all performing arts from around New Zealand had a voice.

2018 Entry Fees & APRA Levies: The Board recommended that these stay the same for 2017 (95c & \$1.00) and the Meeting agreed with this recommendation. The APRA portion remains at .05c and the 2018 Annual Subs had a minimal increase to \$130.00.


<u>PACANZ Board:</u> One new Board member was appointed following the resignation of Tracey Andrew (Central North Island), who did not stand for re-election. Tracey, was recognised by President Deanna Watson for her energy, knowledge and commitment to the performing arts and it was hoped that Tracey would be able to return to the Competition movement in the future. Joanne La Grouw who is President of both Rotorua Competitions Society and the New Zealand Aria Trust was voted in as the new delegate. Joanne brings a wealth of knowledge in both the performing arts and the not for profit sector to the Board, especially in the non-dance genres.

2018 Annual General Meeting: The Meeting chose Auckland as the City to host the Annual General meeting in 2018. It was also decided to continue the practice of avoiding the school holidays, Easter and Anzac day that impact on much of April. The AGM will therefore be held on Saturday May 5th 2018.

<u>General Business:</u> Two items of General business had been submitted for the meeting to discuss. Topics covered included, the definition of Profession in relation to a dancer and how does full time training fit with the definition and the Structure of the Board and ensuring adequate regional representation.

2018 National Young Performer Dates: Following on from the General Business discussion in regards to the later School holidays in 2017, the meeting discussed the implications and options for the usual October dates for the NYPA. If the NYPA were held on the usual weekend (mid teens of October) then it would be the last weekend of the School holidays. The meeting felt that this could impact significantly on the many Societies who hold their Competitions in the September School holidays. The decision was made, that providing the Venues were available, that the NYPA would again be held a week later in 2018 being 19-21st October, Labour Weekend.

<u>Troupe/Group Award:</u> The Troupe/Group Award was brought back as part of the 40th Anniversary Celebrations & as expected, proved to be an overwhelming success, both in terms of the energy and skill the competitors brought to the Stage but also through increased revenue for the NYPA through ticket sales. It has created so much excitement and energy at the regional Competitions, that the Societies were keen to continue to offer it!! The updated Troupe/Group criteria will be sent to Societies with the 2018 Soloist Art form criteria.

Ongoing Initiatives for the 2017 National Young Performer Awards:

NYPA Audience Choice Award Was introduced in 2015 and was warmly received by both the audiences and the recipients. In 2017, as in previous years, it will be awarded to a competitor from each art form and will be chosen entirely by the audience. It will be based on the semi-finals for each art form and every member of the audience at the semi-finals will be allocated a voting slip. The results will be announced during the medal presentation ceremony which is when the Potential Prizes will also be announced. Should the winner of the Audience Choice Award be competing in the Finals, then the result will be announced as part of the Final Prizegiving ceremony.

A cash prize of \$100 will be given to each Award winner and the Board



In Remembrance: Eris Lynne Walker (1944-2017)

Shortly before the AGM in May this year, Eris Walker sent through her apology as she was unable to attend. This would be the first PACANZ AGM that Eris had missed since 2004 and it was with great sadness that we learned of her decline in health and then passing in August.

Eris was so well known though out the PACANZ membership and will always be remembered for her forthright no nonsense attitude, her IT expertise and uncanny prowess on her lpad, which was present at every meeting, her unwavering eye for detail and accuracy and her commitment, dedication and passion as a Volunteer for young people and the performing arts.


Thanks to the Wanganui Competitions Society and to Eris' daughter Bridget for the following Eulogy.

Eris was born in Rotorua on 7^{th} December 1944. She passed away peacefully surrounded by family at Hospice Whanganui on 9^{th} August 2017.

Eris' love for performing arts has always been simmering since a young age, but it wasn't until the mid-nineties that it fully surfaced.

After 4 boys she finally had a daughter, Bridget, whom she entered into ballet lessons as early as possible. This made way for Bridget to be entered into competitions and for Eris to make her ballet costumes (her first tutu she still has to this day). Eris continued to make dance costumes for Bridget's ballet studios, and continued this when the family moved to Wanganui, namely The Shirley McDouall School of Dance, of which she did basically all costumes on stage for the end of year shows. She made costumes for many dancers, to be worn at their competitions.

Just 2 years after moving to Wanganui, Pat Williams asked Eris to join the Wanganui Competitions Society when they needed more help. She soon be-



In 2004, she became involved with PACANZ on a national level and was always willing to share her knowledge and expertise with other Competition Societies and the PACANZ Board.

Many of the families who came to the competitions have emailed their condolences to the society, some from as far away as Queenstown, all mentioning how much she will be missed, giving encouraging words to those that are a bit shy, or felt they didn't do the best they could. It was incredibly touching for the family that young members from the Dean McKerras School of Dance made a special trip to see her in theHospice, this brought a massive smile to her face.

Eris' Family will be donating an award in remembrance of Eris, this award will be presented by a family member at the next competitions in October. Eris will be missed by dancers, musicians, singers, and performing artists all over the country. Her absence will be felt at future competitions for years to come.

She has left a void that will take many years and people to fill.

Over the past 6 years as Executive Officer of PACANZ, Eris and I have spent many hours on the phone and have shared many, many emails. At times she was our biggest critic but more often than not she was our most vocal supporter and we could always find common ground if it involved young people and performing. Eris and her team always welcomed me and local Board member Maryanne enthusiastically, to their October Dance Comps & we can all only hope to emulate her passion and energy as we follow in her footsteps. *NMC*
